Eleven items in this month's Awakening Democracy.

Keeping government democratic in times of pandemic and after

- 1. Look at the work being done at the Grata Fund to monitor the laws being introduced during covid restrictions. And a report, In democracy we Trust, on the sidelining of parliament. They offer a set of recommendations about what should be happening.
- **2.** CAPaD submitted to the Senate Standing Committee for the Scrutiny of Delegated Legislation Inquiry into exemption of delegated legislation from parliamentary oversight during COVID-19. Our submission in on the inquiry website here. We are one of 18 submitters in this specialised area.
- **3. Saving democracy post Covid** The <u>Museum of Australian Democracy</u> and the <u>Institute for Governance and Policy Analysis</u> at the University of Canberra are inviting people a join a really exciting unique experiment: <u>How can we save democracy in a post-COVID 19 world?</u> This is about reviewing a new book as part of <u>a Facebook group</u> or by <u>emailing Mark Evans directly</u>. This is part of <u>their Democracy 2025 project</u>. More details if you want to join at the end of the links.
- 4. Peter Tait's piece asking what the role of the public health community in defending democracy is during this time of covid, As Australia slips toward fascism, where does the public health community stand?, is in Croakey. His follow up piece Standing against the slide to fascism: what can public health do now? is also on Croakey.
- 5. Finally, the Assistant Minister to the Prime Minister responded to our 5 April petition asking for parliament to sit during the pandemic (on June 19th). He claims that parliament is not sitting for fewer days than in previous years; planned 65 days for the House and 53 for the Senate (plus 15 days of Estimates). This is down from the previous timetable of 72 and 57 days (plus 19 days) respectively. Comparably there were 64, 65 and 45 days House sittings in 2017, 2018 and 2019 (an election year). So, no problem?
