Candidate Statements

At present there are 137 candidates and we have received 26 completed statements: 10 Green, 6 Canberra Progressive, 5 ACT Labor, 4 Independents and 1 Federation Party ACT. Canberra Liberals have written that their candidates don't do this.

Feedback is that one party doesn't get involved in single issue questionnaires such a as ours. Given

that party's name, Smaller parties have been difficult to contact.

Meanwhile, please keep asking candidates if they have made as statement. Even better, if they have, tell them you have read it.
