And related to this: Subjective Economic Inequality Decreases Emotional Intelligence, Especially for People of High Social Class

"A series of studies published in <u>Social Psychological and Personality Science</u> found that people of higher socioeconomic status (SES) score consistently lower on tests of emotional intelligence, especially when they perceive high levels of inequality in their community. The researchers suggest that high SES and high subjective inequality promotes increased self-focus and less motivation to attend to others' emotions." (reference)

This helps explain the behaviour of our political elites.
