FEDERAL ELECTION

Candidate Statement

This federal election we have decided not to run the Candidate Statements. We receive much better coverage and response from candidates in the ACT elections. So we may reserve our energy until 2024.

In the ACT in this election, a lot is happening. The main action is in the Senate with proACT promoting an independent senate candidate to run alongside the major party candidates and the host of minor party and other independents. Watch their web space and twitter.

Action on climate change and integrity in parliament and government are the two big issues for this election. During the campaign we invite you to think that you are interviewing candidates for a job, the job of representing you in parliament.

Voting for stronger democracy

The <u>Big Deal</u> upset many people by publicising how our politics is being bought by big donors. Since then, the Australian Democracy Network has released <u>its report Confronting State Capture</u>.

In parallel the **Centre for Public Integrity**, released a <u>Blueprint to Rein in Money in Politics</u>, setting out the following four priority reforms:

- Require real time disclosure of donations over \$1000
- Implement spending caps
- Implement donations caps
- Strengthen enforcement and compliance through the Australian Electoral Commission and a National Integrity Commission.

For sitting members, find out what they have done, how they spend, and lots more about them at <u>Political Gadgets</u>. They also have websites. Find information about ACT's electorates via the <u>Active Democracy ACT</u> webpage.

New candidates – well, think of them as potential job applicants. Critically you want to know if elected, **how** are they going to:

- Help you participate in in decisions about issues that affect your electorate?
- Let you know what they are doing for you in parliament?

Do they commit to vote for the following priority accountability reforms:

- Require real time disclosure of donations over \$1000
- Implement political donations caps
- Implement election spending caps
- Strengthen enforcement and compliance through the Australian Electoral Commission and a National Integrity Commission
- Legislation to require truth in political advertising?

ACTIVE PROJECTS

OTHER ACTIVITY

VOTES FOR 16 YEAR OLDS?

The ACT Greens are campaigning for 16 and 17 year olds to vote. CAPaD has not taken on this as an activity due to the complexity of the issue and our own capacity to contribute sensibly.

On Freedom

Freedom (liberty) is one of those concepts with two sides; freedom to (do) and freedom from. Three hundred years of debate (Mill to Burnheim and Pettit) has moved the discourse from individual liberty as freedom from monarchy and state to a more nuanced balance of freedom from and freedom to, with checks and balances. Like democracy it is eternally a work in progress and requires active management to keep the balance. Recent protests calling for freedom have not captured this balance. Democracy is eroded by selfish, untruthful, often violent individualism. Lessons from John Stuart Mill.

Media

We frequently hear from members and supporters their concerns about the role of the media in Australia's government, undermining our democracy.

Last year GetUp produced a report, Who controls our media? The impact of media concentration on our democracy.
