CAPaD Election Action – Contribute to good government

We received \$900 in donations which enabled us to buy two quarter page advertisements in the City News. Thank you to the very generous donors; much appreciated.

This is the advert from 28 April, which will be run again on May 12.

We have also had some response to letters in the Canberra Times, around queries for more information on candidates and voting.

Website visits and pageview data reflect that this publicity is being noticed.

The take home for voters in this election is to use all your preferences on both ballot papers.

For the House of Reps (green) ballot paper this is essential to avoid an invalid vote.

For the Senate (white ballot paper) where the AEC stipulates you number a minimum of six boxes above

the line and 12 below, numbering the 7th to 12th boxes above the line and 13th to 23rd boxes below the line can tip the preferences flows toward or away from particular candidates. This is particularly the case in close contests, which is how the ACT Senate race is shaping up (see below).




Importantly for those asking how does preferential voting work and how are the votes counted:

This video explains how the House of Representative <u>preferential voting system works and how votes are</u> counted.

This <u>video from Voices of North Sydney</u> (for the recent NSW State by-election so of relevance to the Senate voting) explains the importance of using <u>all your preferences</u> even when optional, so that your vote is not extinguished – the key message is that candidates who may have got elected might miss out because they didn't quite get enough votes through preference flows.


OTHER ACTIVITY

At the moment our energy is going into the election.


In June we will be floating new electorate level activity ideas for Canberra, looking to take the conversations from Demfest21 forward.
