There is a rich ecosystem of organisations in Australia whose aim is to assist voters choose quality candidates and support keeping MPs accountable. See figure.


Awakening Democracy Foundation

OTHER ACTIVITY

CAPaD's future activity focus

Report back (23rd October Zoom)

The move to an education focus confirmed where CAPaD had need headed already.

Deductible gift recipient status is an opportunity to be pursued to help build capacity.

No one clear project emerged as being where our biggest leverage point is, although education around civics for schools and the general public has advantages.

There was both support and concerns with a national focus.

Several ideas for revising the constitution were put forward and will be pursued next year. The idea of a name change was vetoed.

THINGS TO READ AND LISTEN TO

Just a reminder about the **Democracy Sausage podcast** from the ANU Public Policy Institute (on a podcast service near you). Lots of very topical topics.

The articles that kicked off the Collective Impact movement are <u>Collective Impact</u> and <u>Channeling Change – Making Collective Impact Work</u>. A great deal has been written since then. They worked for US non-profit consulting firm FSG, and I think the systems change language came from a later article they wrote with Peter Senge called <u>The Water of Systems Change</u>.

<u>John Austin</u>, the director of the Michigan Economic Center, and <u>Elaine Dezenski</u>, senior director and head of the Center on Economic and Financial Power at the Foundation for Defense of Democracies; <u>Democracy needs a new sales pitch</u>.
