Active Democracy ACT (ADACT) & Australia (ADAus)

This year **Active Democracy Bean** (ADB) is focussing on strengthening the quality of community conversations leading up to the referendum on the First Nations Voice to Parliament. If you would like to deepen your own knowledge of what is being proposed, we suggest looking at the <u>From the Heart website</u>, which has accessible and clear educational material. Please share with your friends and family.

If you already support the constitutional change and want to engage the community on the issues involved, consider signing up to be a <u>volunteer</u> with From the Heart or to run a Kitchen Table Conversation (KTC), called <u>Together,Yes</u>. This is being devised by the Victorian Women's Trust (some will remember Mary Crooks who did the See Change KTC training many years ago) who are working closely with From the Heart. The programme will be launched in February.
