Get Political: Communities taking action June 3

The Community Independents Project 2023 Convention was held on Saturday June 3rd. The main focus was on the community independents who were elected last year reflecting on their experience in order to help more independents get up in the 2025 federal election.

One particular session was looking at why young people join in. The single work answer is **rage**. Their priorities were: helping young people understand the political system, action on climate change, integrity in politics and the quality of the policy debate (rated very poor). Their suggestion: listen to us. And make being involved fun. Unsurprising but salutary.

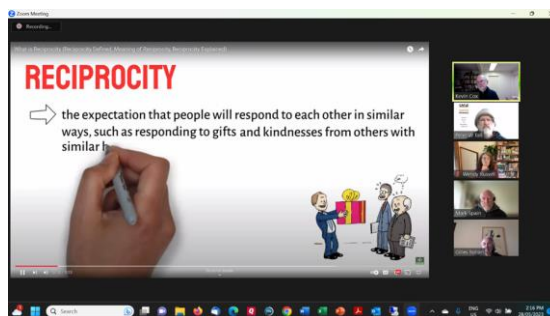
