Achievements in the past year (summary):

- Continuing to help <u>Active Democracy Australia</u> (ADAus) organisation and website revisions and resources expansion.
- Support and publicise the ADAus Technology Supporting Democracy project.
- Continuing support for <u>Active Democracy Bean</u> in the ACT with their Listening posts on the Voice to Parliament.
- Working with DemocracyCo and Alicia Payne to run a Citizens' Jury event, the **Canberra Forum**, in the federal seat of Canberra.
- Coordinating the observers for the Canberra Forum.
- Using the Genuine Engagement Tool to reflect on the Canberra Forum.
- Revise and update the <u>Genuine Engagement Tool</u>.
- **Submission** to Perpetual Trustees for an Impact Grant: unsuccessful despite making it to the semi-final round.
- Application for DGR status submitted and rejected. Involved extensive discussion among the Committee and members about the constitutional objectives and CAPaD's purpose and focus, which is reflected in the proposed further constitutional changes at the 2023 AGM. The application is being revised for resubmission in 2024.
- Describing the ACT Community Democracy ecosystem.
- Promoting the <u>Australian Democracy Network</u> and their **#OurDemocracy campaign** for a <u>Framework for a Fair Democracy</u> and <u>the Fair Play Bill</u>.
- Continued to refine and add content to <u>the **Resources Hub**</u> (core component to the Education Strategy).
- Consistent production of monthly <u>newsletters Awakening Democracy</u>.
- Initiating the <u>Education for Civics</u> project.
- Continued regular emails to members, forwarding information, ideas and event notifications.
- Active in the Twittersphere and on Facebook promoting our events and ideas, and relevant ones by others.
- Two Zoom Events held in 2023.

Details of 2022-23 achievements

Support Active Democracy Australia

Mark Spain and Peter Tait have continued active engagement on the management committee of Active Democracy Australia (ADAus), along with founder Rob Salter and Marcus Crowley. The main focus this year has been ongoing maintenance of the website and adding two new electorate groups. ADAus also ran two Technology Supporting Democracy zoom sessions. An ongoing collaboration with he Change Politics project of the New Democracy Foundation is looking at producing materials for electorate groups on deliberative techniques.

In parallel, CAPaD has continued to support <u>Active Democracy Bean</u>. Currently ADBean is running a series of community listening Posts on the Voice to Parliament, drawing on the TogetherYes campaign KTC materials. Two of four support zoom sessions have been held.

The Canberra Forum in the federal seat of Canberra

The Canberra Forum was organised and run for Alicia Payne by DemocracyCo following our introducing them to each other last year. CAPaD supported the Forum by coordinating the observers to the face-to-face sessions. In all nine members and supporters observed one or more of the sessions.

CAPaD members have applied the Genuine Engagement Tool to their experience of the Forum with the view to reflect back to DemocracyCo and Alicia Payne what went well and what might be improved.



One of our desired outcomes from this experiment is to develop a kit that can be used by other MPs or electorate groups to undertake similar exercises in electorate level deliberation. We are in discussion with DemocracyCo on establishing a partnership for this.

Genuine Engagement Tool (GET)

This year we revised and <u>re-published the tool template</u> on the website for communities to use themselves. So far there has been only one download, although half a years data was lost when Google Analytics crossed to their new application.

Submission to Perpetual Trustees We made a funding submission for an Impact Grant in October 2023 which involved significant work to develop a strategy and reporting framework. We sought funds for a project worker to run a *Keeping them Honest* campaign. This project was to assist in developing a community designed job description for MPs and look at how to report MPs' activity back to their electorate. The intent was to then feature this in the 2024 ACT and 2025 federal elections. Our application unsuccessful despite making it to the semi-final round.

Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) Application

The next step following successful achievement of charity status last year is to apply for DGR status. Since CAPaD doesn't fit the education categories within the ATO system, we had to apply for specific inclusion in the Income Tax Assessment Act. This is not a straight forward process.

The purpose of DGR is to enhance our capacity to raise funds by being able to offer tax-deductibility for donations to the Awakening Democracy Foundation. An application was made for assessment in the May 2023 budget process. We were not successful. Another application for DGR status in progress.

Education Strategy Activity

- Maintaining <u>the Resources Hub</u> took a back seat this year due to capacity being directed to DGR and the Perpetual Trustees grant applications. Should anyone have an interest in curating this Hub, please feel free to contact us.
- Two <u>Zoom Events</u>: one on localising and democratising energy systems presented by Kevin Cox, Mark Spain and Wendy Russell, and one expanding on the well attended Canberra Conversation on democracy in May. It featured Tim Hollo and Mark Spain elaborating on how to live democracy into being.
- Initiating the <u>Education for Civics</u> project; this arose from conversations at the 2022 Community Independents Project convention where quite a lot of interest in the topic was found. Progress has been slow despite high interest due to other's other commitments. However, a Teams group and mailing list have been set up.
- Successful monthly <u>Awakening Democracy newsletters</u>.
- Continued regular emails to members publicising other organisations activity and events,
- Regular activity in the Twittersphere to promote our own and others' activity and events; and
- The <u>Australian Democracy Network</u> #OurDemocracy campaign for <u>Framework for a Fair</u> <u>Democracy</u> and <u>the Fair Play Bill</u>. This involved publicising the campaign to members and keeping people in touch with events and developments.

Education activity


