What's happening with Active Democracy Bean? (ADB)

In response to interested yes23 volunteers, ADB will continue to focus on First Nations justice issues in 2024 particularly in the lead up to the ACT election in October.

This will involve:

- initiating conversations in the broader community around existing government mechanisms and initiatives to close the gap and how well these are/are not working
- holding our elected representatives to account for commitments on First Nations justice issues made before the last election and during the last term of government
- continuing to build a community of citizens in Bean who are active in their democracy.

We will do this by:

hosting monthly gatherings with a guest speaker at the Irish Club

- organising formal meetings with current MLAs to ask questions/relay concerns/discuss their position
- engaging with candidates to discuss their priorities regarding First Nations justice
- engaging with organisers of candidate forums to ensure questions include those First Nations priorities.

A picture is emerging confirming the need for better education for civics in schools and the community. No one seems satisfied with the current situation. I've spoken with several people over the past months and the MP I spoke with, teachers, past students, a current student and parents all agree that it doesn't work.

I have also discovered that people are trialling a wide variety of one off, brief programs in schools across Australia.

Finally, a couple of people observed that while the majority focus is on the Australian political system, who is education young people in the ACT about the ACT system?

THINGS TO READ AND LISTEN TO

Our standing reminders about:

- Democracy Sausage podcast from the ANU Public Policy Institute. Lots of very topical topics, and

- Juice Media for an <u>irreverent and spicy look at current politics</u> in Australia and beyond.
- Crazy Town From the Post Carbon Institute (go to Products/Podcasts). 2025 season in prep but lots of back episodes to listen to.

The March of Autocracy, the eleventh issue of Australian Foreign Affairs, "examines the rise of authoritarian and illiberal leaders, whose growing assertiveness is reshaping the Western-led world order." With some focus on China and our relationship with her. Introducing John Keane's idea of Phantom Democracy which is not the pseudo-democracy of autocratic states, but a different way of doing democracy. The Real Divide

Robert Reich, expert on economic inequality, says the real societal divide is not between Left and Right but **democracy** and **oligarchy** (perhaps plutocracy), which he covers in The System: Who Rigged It, How We Fix It. 11 minute video explainer here. See the Crazy Town Episode on Jack Welch to see how the system rigging happened. Reich's conclusion is that we must organise cooperatively to fight for democracy.

<u>Purpose</u> has published a report, <u>Online Challenges for Election Integrity</u>, looking at the use of social media in spreading mis- / disinformation and hate speech. They comment on the media's role in amplifying this. Recommendations include:

"We recommend the development of civil society, election commission, and government programs that reward and engage constructive participation in election monitoring in ways that undermine and crowd out bad faith actors." Another thread to the Education for Civics bow!
