<p>2 How can we know which candidate will be a good representative?</p>	<p>Using the criteria developed in the first conversation (and any new ones that come out of the second conversation), small groups will develop a second set of criteria to use when looking at the candidates standing for election, to assess how they might let us know if they will be a representative worth voting for.</p> <p>After the event, these ideas will be assembled into a report.</p> <p>This will be publicised widely.</p>	In August
<p>3 How do the candidates wanting your vote plan to represent you? How are they going to hear their community's voice?</p>	<p>Town halls will be held in each ACT electorate to give voters an opportunity to ask candidates how they will represent their electorate community if they are elected.</p>	In September
