Conversation 3 report back

Conversation 3 produced a set of six questions that Canberran want their candidates to answer. Before publishing them widely we are inviting parties, groups and candidates to receive a briefing on the Conversations.



In late August we will make them widely available to voters. We are also inviting all candidates to the Know you Candidate Forums (see below) where they can respond to the questions publicly.

- their qualifications and diverse experience;
- leadership experience;
- how are they going to engage the community;

Constitutional amendments

Early this year Access Canberra released the new model rules for incorporated associations, such as CAPaD. There have also been some minor amendments not made in recent years because our focus was on bringing the objectives to reflect our educational focus and prepares for a DGR application. The new model rules give us an opportunity to tidy up our constitution and bring the language and rules up to date. The proposed changes are <u>available on our website</u>.
